Happy November! Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for November **9th** and November **15th** unless you have made other arrangements with your child's teacher. Meeting with your child's teacher will help build the strong partnership that is needed to reach our common goal: helping your child get the best education possible.

Your child's teacher will come prepared with samples of work and with ideas to help them do even better in school. You should get ready for each conference, too. Be sure and talk with your child before the conference. Ask your child if there is something specific they would like you to talk about with their teacher. Find out what their most and least favorite part of the day is. Make sure your child doesn't worry about the meeting. Help them understand that you and their teacher are meeting together to help them. Before you go to the school, think about your child's personality traits, habits, home life, and hobbies that you feel are important for the teacher to know about. Think about asking questions about:

- You child's progress
- Strengths and opportunities
- Favorite subjects or topics
- Relationships with other children
- Participation in discussions
- Quality of work

Most importantly, remember that we are all working together to help your child be a successful, safe, responsible, and respectful student!

If you would like to provide a new bottle of Tylenol or ibuprofen for your child's use during school hours, please come in with the medication. The school may NOT carry medications. Remember, YOU must bring it, and the bottle must be new/unopened. Students may NOT carry medications to and from school.

Mid November I will begin screening all students vision, with parent's permission, during the school day. A bright green notice will be coming home. If you would like me to screen your child's vision, complete the form and return it to your child's teacher.

As the weather gets cooler, please have your child wear outside clothing, as they go out for recess daily. The temperature sure can change quickly!!
