Crater Lake is the deepest lake (1,958 feet 597 m) in the United States and the seventh deepest lake in the world.

The lake is formed in the caldera of a destroyed volcano called Mount Mazama.

About 4860 BC, Mazama erupted and collapsed forming a large caldera that later filled with water.

The caldera is about 6 miles wide.
