**Reminder About Dialing Change:** As of Sunday, October 24, New Hampshire residents must dial 10-digits (area code plus number) for all local calls. The change is a result of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopting 988 as the new three-digit number to be used nationwide to reach the National Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Crisis Lifeline.
