If your child will be turning 5 or 6 years old by Sept. 30, 2020 and you haven't registered them for school yet there is still time. You will need to bring proof of residency (rent receipt, purchase/lease agreement, voter registration, 2 current utility bills, court placement copy of decree, or social services papers), a birth certificate with raised seal or a passport, immunization records and proof of physical examination. Only the child's parent or legal guardian can register their own child. You can come to the office to get a registration packet or you can download the forms on our district web-

If your child is attending preschool at one of the Nashua public schools, you must still register your child for Kindergarten at your neighborhood school. If your child is presently attending Kindergarten at one of the Nashua public schools, you DO NOT need to register your child for first grade—they will automatically be registered.

Recess/PE Reminder — I frequently get phone calls or notes from parents requesting that their child stay in for recess or be excused from gym class due to illness, injury or weather. Please remember that it is a school district policy that ALL children go out to recess and participate in gym UNLESS THEY HAVE A DOCTOR'S NOTE. Please don't hesitate to call me if you have additional questions.

<u>GENTLE REMINDER</u>— please remember to keep your child home from school if he/she has any of the following symptoms: fever of 100 degrees or higher, vomiting, diarrhea, severe cough, sore throat, severe cold, of conjunctivitis. Your child **MUST** stay home for 24 hours after the fever is gone without the use of Tylenol or Motrin to reduce the fever.

ATTN: 5th Grade Parents – The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services highly encourages that when your child turns 11 years of age they receive a Tdap vaccine. Please send in an updated copy of your child's immunization report so that their school health record can be updated. Copies of immunization records may also be faxed directly to school by your child's health care provider. Our fax number is: 603-882 -2332. Immunizations are also available at the Nashua Health Department at 18 Mulberry St. for a small fee. Clinics are held on Tuesday from 4:00 pm - 7:00pm and Fridays from 8:30am -10:30am. Please call 589-4500 to verify clinic times and dates. A parent or legal guardian must accompany a child under age 18. You must bring his/her immunization record with you to the appointment.
