NURSES NOTES

Our 2019 Flu Clinic was a success with over 100 students vaccinated at the school based clinic this year. Cold and flu season is here! You can help protect yourself from illness by these steps:

- Wash hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid kissing, hugging and sharing cups or eating utensils with people who are sick
- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces, such as toys and doorknobs, especially if someone is sick.

Any medication should be delivered to the school by the parent or guardian and must be in its original package from the pharmacy or manufacturer. No prescription medication may be administered to your child without a written doctor's note, and a release form signed by the parent or guardian. For safety reasons: ** <u>Do not send any medicine in to school with your</u> <u>child.**</u> Please deliver directly to the nurse or secretary.

NEWS FROM THE GYM

Running is a great lifetime activity as we encourage children to strive for at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day. Swimming, dancing, skiing, skating, hiking, tennis, cycling, walking, and golf are some other great activities you can do together as a family. Raking and bagging leaves can also be a good workout for the whole family while enjoying the fresh air! Please help your children to notice the physiological changes that their bodies undergo when exercising, and how good that feels. We have discussed how it is normal for a person to breathe faster and have a faster pulse when exercising. Your children should be able to explain to you how they can take their own pulse. Encourage your children to stretch while at home when they have down time. They can stretch while reading and watching television. If your children forget the stretches, they can check the walls inside the gym.

We finished Frisbee activities and are now going into soccer activities. We took time to also discuss fire safety during fire prevention month. Please make sure that your children have the correct sneakers and clothes on their PE days along with their hair pulled back out of their face. I would suggest putting extra elastics, headbands, and hair clips in your child's backpack.

NEWS FROM THE ART ROOM

Autumn is the theme for art on display in the halls at Birch Hill. Colorful self-portraits came to life with our kindergarten students, as well as a favorite color mixing lesson with "Monsters Love Colors!" Red, yellow and green apples were drawn and painted by Grade 1 artists; learning how to observe, sketch and use a paintbrush like a ballerina! Mixing to make orange pumpkin faces was so much fun!
