Thank you for supporting your child and our school during the testing period.


March is Reading Month

ELL ACCESS Test Proficiency

Each year, Nashua students in the English language learner (ELL) program take the <u>ACCESS for</u> <u>ELLs language proficiency test</u>. The test measures academic English language proficiency for students learning English in our school. Student progress will be measured in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. English learners in Nashua School District will complete ACCESS testing between February 1 and March 22. We will receive the results in late May and a copy will be sent home with the students to parents/guardians.

Reminders from the Office
