COVID-19 Guidelines

August 26, 2022 Revised

NSD will operate in-school daily, as expected, during the 2022-2023 school year; remote learning is not an option.

NSD will continue to follow public health guidelines, including encouragement of up-to-date COVID-19 vaccination.

Masks are optional, except when recovering from COVID-19 (please see related item below).

If tested COVID-19 positive, stay home five days; return as long as fever-free for 24-hours and wear a mask for days 6-10. If unable or unwilling to wear a mask, staff/students must stay home full 10 days.

If a student presents to the school nurse during the school day with symptoms that may indicate a COVID infection, the nurse may test the student if a POC permission form is on file. The parent will be notified both prior to the test being administered and after with the results.

Quarantine after international or local travel is not required.

Staff/students should stay home if displaying symptoms of COVID-19, and pursue testing.

Staff/students continue to report COVID positive test results to school principal/school nurse.

Weekly reporting to all parents/staff of positive cases of COVID-19 from the Office of the Superintendent will continue, at least through mid-October.

All volunteer service resumes, including in-school volunteer service.
